3. **JURISDICTION OF THE COURT**

The parents shall cooperate with each other in sharing information related to the health, education, and welfare of the child and they shall sign any necessary documentation ensuring that both parents have access to said records.

Each parent shall be responsible for obtaining records and reports directly from the school and health care providers.

Both parents have equal rights to inspect and receive governmental agency and law enforcement records concerning the child.

Both parents shall have equal and independent authority to confer with the child's school, day care, health care providers, and other programs with regard to the child's educational, emotional, and social progress.

Both parents shall be listed as "parents" and as "emergency contacts" for the child with schools, medical providers, extra-curricular activities, and the like.

Each parent has a continuing responsibility to provide his/her residential, mailing and contact address, e-mails and telephone numbers (including work, home and cell) to the other parent. Each parent shall notify the other parent in writing within 24 hours of any changes. Each parent shall notify the court in writing within seven (7) days of any changes in residential or mailing address or contact telephone numbers.

ii. **Extra-curricular Activities** (Check only one)

The parents shall discuss any differences between the calendars and reach an agreement for the following school year.

b. Schedule Changes

A parent making a request for a schedule change will make the request as soon as possible, but in any event no less than before the change is to occur.

If a parent is unable to care for the child during his/her time-sharing for one (1) or more overnights, then that parent shall give the other parent the right of first refusal to care for the child during that time prior to arranging alternate care for the child.

A parent requesting a change of schedule shall be responsible for any additional child care, or transportation costs caused by the change.

If there is three (3) day weekend observed by the school of the child which is not provided for in the holiday schedule above, then the parent who would normally have that weekend shall be entitled to the extra day as part of his/her weekend.

The foregoing holiday schedule will take priority over the regular weekday, weekend, and summer schedules. If the form above for a holiday above is not specified as even, odd, or every year with the parent who spends less time with the child, then the child will remain with the parents in accordance with the regular weekday and weekend schedule set forth above.

When the parents are using an alternating weekend plan and the holiday schedule would result in one parent having the child for three (3) weekends in a row, the parents will exchange the following weekend, so that each has two weekends in a row before the regular alternating weekend pattern resumes.

ON DECEMBER 26TH, AND THE FATHER SHALL HAVE THE CHILD FROM 1:00 P.M. ON DECEMBER 26TH UNTIL THE DAY PRIOR TO SCHOOL RESUMES, AND THAT THE PARTIES ALTERNATE THIS SCHEDULE IN ODD YEARS.
